

Sport Premium Funding

Background

In April 2013, the government announced new funding of £150 million for physical education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision.

Funding will be allocated to all maintained and state-funded schools with primary aged pupils, including: primary, middle, special and non-maintained special schools, academies and pupil referral units from 1 September 2013. Annually, all Schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil.

P.E. and School Sport is an important part of school life at Swainby & Potto & Ingleby Arncliffe Primary School, we believe that P.E. and sport contribute to the holistic development of our children as healthy and well rounded individuals. Through participation, our children develop and learn more about key values such as respect, co-operation, team work and consideration for others.

Our aim is to develop lifelong interests in sport and health which are enriching and fulfilling.

Sports premium funding for Ingleby Arncliffe and Swainby & Potto for April 2016 to March 2017 is £22318. Funding from April 2017 is expected to be around £16000 for the next financial year.

With the money we have been allocated so far, we have been able to...

Up-skill teachers to improve the quality of PE lessons.

We have bought in a specialist PE teacher/co-ordinator to provide:

- ❖ a programme of professional development for our staff. This has improved the confidence of teacher's when teaching PE and developed their skills in ensuring all our children access high quality PE teaching.
- ❖ This has also helped us with the integration of the pupils across the three schools (Swainby & Potto, Ingleby Arncliffe and Osmotherley) to participate as one 'Mount Grace Schools Sports team'. Thus, allowing us to compete on a fairer level with the correct age range of children as opposed to them missing out or playing up 2-3 years, which goes against the good practise of most national sports governing bodies. This joined up principle in sport has been in operation for over 10 years, but the funding has allowed us to give a consistent approach, better planning and an enjoyable experience for the children.

Investing in quality coaching

We have worked closely with North Yorkshire Sport and the Sports National Governing Bodies to access coaching programmes including:

- ❖ FA Skills Coach (James Lofthouse) – 10 weeks coaching and teacher mentoring.
- ❖ Cricket Club-School Link – via Stokesley & Northallerton CC
- ❖ Orienteering – CloK Orienteering Club, School & Community Club
- ❖ Rugby – Duncan Burgess (Thirsk Area SGO)
- ❖ Tennis – Claire Smith (Hutton Rudby Tennis Club)
- ❖ Basketball – Jordan N & Theo T Teesside Mowhawks BC
- ❖ Football – After-school Club Friday Evenings

Purchase better PE equipment

We have been able to better resource our PE lessons with quality equipment for teaching and assessing children as they develop their skills. We have been able to ensure that the school teams who compete in local competitions have high quality equipment and kit.

Transport

It gives us the opportunity to get the children together from all the schools to play in their own year groups. It also supports transportation to all the sports events.

Other Events:

Forest Schools – There is a programme of outdoor recreation opportunities throughout school, the activities range from beck scrambling, Den building, survival skills, orienteering.

Orienteering – Swainby School and Village was mapped with funding through Sport England via North Yorkshire Sport. A 10 week course was held at Swainby School followed by a Community Club being established in Swainby Village Hall to serve the 3 villages.
